**Minutes of the Meeting**  
**PFA – Andhra Pradesh**

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Venue: Ministry of Power, Conference Hall, Shram Shakti Bhawan, New Delhi

Date: 13<sup>th</sup> November, 2014

Time: 3:00PM – 4:30 PM

Special Secretary Power (SS) welcomed all the participants in the first PFA review meeting. Representatives from MNRE, MoEF, Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Coal, Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas, Ministry of Railways, Ministry of Agriculture, EESL and PSUs were present. List of participant is enclosed as Annexure. He emphasised on the purpose of calling the PFA meeting as under:

- a) The PFA documents have been prepared by the AP State and Ministry of Power jointly. This meeting will set the path for operationalizing PFA and delineating actionable points.
- b) It was clarified that there are no separate funds for the PFA scheme. Therefore funding shall be made under the existing schemes of GOI/States. States can customise their proposal under existing RGGVY and RAPDRP Schemes which are being merged with the Deen Dyal Upadhya Gram Jyoti Yojna (DDUGJY) and Integrated Power Development Scheme (IPDS) respectively or for the schemes covering under MNRE. However, states selected under PFA would be given priority in these schemes subject to fulfilment of necessary conditions.

- He further intimated that four more states are being taken up for the PFA Scheme. REC has been appointed as a nodal agency and responsible for all coordinating and monitoring the PFA Scheme. The monitoring will be done paperless and CPMU is being operationalized. Dr. Dinesh Arora mentioned that agenda notes were circulated one week in advance with actionable points and States were advised to bring a small presentation on the updated status of the PFA implementation, defined timelines and milestones and any deviations from the planned milestones based on the circulated agenda.

The Secretary Energy, GOAP gave a brief presentation. Secy intimated that a State Level monitoring committee has been set up, SPMU had been operationalized with KPMG as the consultant and progress under PFA Scheme is monitored fortnightly. GoAP have already initiated action on most of the points as envisaged in the PFA document in the areas of Power procurement, coal imports, AT&C loss reduction, Ultra mega Solar parks & energy efficiency measures.
